At Heron Cross, we aim to give children the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that they need to effectively navigate the complexities of life in the 21st Century. Through the use of the condensed Kapow scheme, we cover key areas which will support children to make informed choices now and in the future around their health, safety, wellbeing, relationships, and financial matters. We strive to support our pupils in becoming confident individuals and active members of society. Our PSHE including Relationships curriculum aims to promote the four fundamental British Values: democracy, rule of law, respect, tolerance and individual liberty through wider school enrichment opportunities and the use of our Heron Cross Values which are an integral part of life at Heron Cross. Although PSHE is taught through explicit lessons, these are then reinforced and enhanced through assemblies, relationships child to child, adult to child and adult to adult across the school and in other subject areas such as Physical Education, Religious Education, Science and Computing.

We aim to:

- Utilise the PSHE including Relationships Kapow scheme to deliver a well-planned progression of skills and knowledge, offering a structured and progressive PSHE education that builds on the child's personal, social, health and economic education. By building on prior knowledge from EYFS to Year 6, children will be gradually introduced to more complex issues and gain an understanding of the world they are growing up in and learn how to live alongside and show respect for a diverse range of people.
- Develop all pupils into confident and informed individuals and equip pupils with the relevant knowledge to make educated decisions about health, wellbeing, relationships, and finances, promoting self-confidence and active citizenship.
- Provide opportunities for pupils to engage in relevant whole school enrichment days or events that link to the five British Values.
