Subject: Geography

Spiritual

 Geography supports spiritual development by promoting a sense of wonder and fascination with the physical and human world. An understanding of scale is an important aspect of Geography and how small changes in climate can have far reaching consequences.

Moral

Geography supports moral development by looking at a range of moral issues such how
the development of cities have put pressure on wildlife. We cover moral issues of an
ever increasing population and the different approaches taken by countries to tackle
the problem. We explore issues of poverty and the moral dilemma of importing food
and the consequences of it on global warming.

Social

Geography supports social development because social issues are common themes
